

Delivering our Digital Health Hub through Lockdown

Our ambition

After the success of the Digital Health Hub launched in September 2019, in partnership with 100% Digital Leeds Cross Gates and District Good Neighbours Scheme were successful in securing funding from Good Things Foundation to continue their work.

People have reported a decreased in health and fitness due to long periods of shielding, isolation, and loneliness.

In response to Covid-19, the services have been adapted to support people remotely and taking into account the effect of the pandemic and lockdown restrictions.

Keeping well at home

Focusing on health and wellbeing Cross Gates and District Good Neighbours Scheme have just started delivering a virtual programme to address the issues of fitness, boredom, motivation, and mental health. Keeping Healthy at Home is a four week course for up to ten members ran via Zoom with a different themes each week. People are encouraged to do activities between the sessions and report back on their progress each week. The course is in partnership with Active Leeds.

Resource packs have been delivered including information and leaflets on scam prevention and staying safe.
